

## Tape Script - PR 5.2

Ash /æ/ (*fat*) vs Script A /ɑ/ (*cot*) or Open O /ɔ/ (*boss*)

(old symbols: Short A -a- vs Short O -o- or Short Back O -ô-)

### PR Tape 5.2 Listening practice for the vowel sounds -a- – short a (/æ/ Ash) – and -o- – short o (/ɑ/ Script A).

*Part 1:* Listen to the pairs of words. The first word in each pair has the -a- sound (Ash) – the same sound you hear in *fat*. The second word in each pair has the -o- sound (Script A) – the same sound you hear in *father*. Listen:

hat - hot

sack - sock

cap - cop

mam - mom

black - block

battle - bottle

*Part 2:* Tell which column each word goes in. Words with -a- (/æ/) go in column 1; words with -o- (/ɑ/) go in column 2. *Hat* is in column 1; *hot* is in column 2. Say “1” or “2”. Begin:

#### Column 1

hat

#### Column 2

hot

*Part 3:* Tell which column each sentence goes in. Sentences with -a- (/æ/) go in column 1; sentences with -o- (/ɑ/) go in column 2. *Did you find the cap?* is in column 1; *Did you find the cop?* is in column 2. Say “1” or “2”. Begin:

#### Column 1

Did you find the cap?

#### Column 2

Did you find the cop?

*Part 1:* Repeat:

Factory workers here often have large salaries.

job satisfaction  
not  
not much job satisfaction  
Factory workers here often have large salaries but not much job satisfaction.

*Part 2:* Repeat the phrases in the box:

fox	hat	can
socks	bag	jacket
hot dog	taxi	rabbit
bottle	salad	wagon
helicopter	camel	hamburger

Now, say **three words** from that box for each category you hear.

Example: clothing                      **socks, hat and jacket**

*Part 3:* Repeat the phrases:
